On April 26th, the Ocean State Center for Independent Living (OSCIL) hosted its annual Independent Living Conference at the Crowne Plaza in Warwick. The event drew an enthusiastic capacity crowd committed to advancing independent living for individuals with disabilities in Rhode Island. We were honored to have the support of our three title sponsors: CCA Health RI, UnitedHealth, and the Rhode Island Statewide Independent Living Council (SILC). Keynote speaker Sandra Swift Parrino recounted her experiences leading up to the signing of the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA). Additionally, five Rhode Islanders received the Catherine T. Murray scholarships for their continuing education and professional development.
